Scope and Contents of the Materials

The Richwine Collection contains materials that were acquired by George C. Richwine, Fred Richwine, and other close family members between 1882 to 1945. The collection was donated by Linda Richwine Klotz (b. 1947).

The collection was named the "Richwine Collection" to facilitate discoverability. Collection materials are of interest to researchers who likely know the Richwine Block or the Richwine Building on the intersection of South 9th Street and Maple Ave, Noblesville Ind., the history of the Richwine & Sons buisiness, or the family history of the Richwine family in Hamilton County Ind.

The collection includes invoices, documents, envelopes, letters, receipts, checks, notes, cards, envelopes, quotes, estimates and notices during the construction of the Richwine Building on the intersection of South 9th Street and Maple Ave, Noblesville Ind. between 1914 to 1915.

The collection includes:

- invoices, documents, envelopes, letters, receipts, contracts, deeds, cards, notices, petitions, summons, checks, notes, loans, schedules, mortgages, sheets, records, statements, debts, checkbooks, certificates, and registrations belonging to George C. Richwine, Fred Richwine, or other close family members.
- receipts, checks, licenses, certificates, tax, schedules, sheets of the Richwine & Sons business during its operation.
- invoices, checks, receipts of tenants who had lived in the Richwine Apartment building on the intersection of South 9th Street and Maple Ave, Noblesville Ind. during the 20th century
- court documents, receipts, petitions, letters, and statements connected to George C. Richwine's Estate after his death in 1927.

Collection Historical Note

The Richwine Apartment building is a three-story building that sits on the intersection of South 9th Street and Maple Avenue in Noblesville, Ind. The building is often referred to as the "Richwine Building" or the "Richwine Block." The building was constructed between 1914 to 1915 by George C. Richwine and Donald Graham. The building was Mission-style and made from yellow-glazed brick and Bedford stone. The first floor was used a salesroom for Richwine & Sons and the upper stories was used as apartments.

Richwine & Sons, the successor of Richwine & Kline, was created in 1907 after Frank Kline sold his interest in the business to George C. Richwine's sons, Wallace and Fred Richwine. The business started as a wagon and buggy manufacturer but was later converted to automobiles as cars gained more popularity. The automobile business dissolved in 1944 after the death of Fred Richwine.

George C. Richwine (b. 1852 - d.1927) was born in Hamilton County, Ind. on September 14th, 1852, to Abraham and Sarah E. (Crim) Richwine. He was a Noblesville High School graduate and taught for two years in Noblesville and Fall Creek township schools. In the fall of 1872, he opened a shoe and boots business with Ed Steward, but nine months later due to the Panic of 1873 the business failed. George C. Richwine returned to working on his father's farm, and during that time he married his wife, Sarah E. Whitsell, on May 27, 1874. In 1879 he left his father's farm and started his career in manufacturing and selling wagons, buggies, and harnesses for horses at South 9th Street, Noblesville Ind. Between 1899 and 1907, he was business partners to Frank Kline until Kline sold his interest to George's sons; Wallace and Fred Richwine. He erected the Richwine Block on South 9th Street and Maple Ave with Donald Graham. He was considered a successful businessman, as well as a very dedicated and friendly landlord

to his tenants. He died of a heart attack on January 18^{th} , 1927, in the middle of Weldy Pharmacy on South 9^{th} Street.
